

A Lecture by Professor Paul Connett

ZERO WASTE: Towards a Sustainable Society

at the Eden Project Foundation Building* on Thursday 13 May 2010 at 7.00 pm

Cornwall's waste management is in crisis and we hope will soon take a new direction, away from incineration. Dr. Paul Connett will talk about this and the broader picture of how we, and the world, should manage waste. He is a graduate of Cambridge University and holds a Ph.D. in Chemistry; from 1983 to 2006 he taught chemistry at St Lawrence University in Canton, NY where he specialised in Environmental Chemistry and Toxicology. Over the past 25 years his research on waste management has taken him to 49 states in the US, and 52 other countries, where he has given over 2,000 pro-bono public presentations. He has recently spoken to the United Nations Division on Sustainable Development on the subject of zero waste. We are extremely lucky to have him in Cornwall to talk on this highly topical subject.
